Bradford Airedale Athletic Club 2022 Annual General Meeting

Friday 11 November 2022, 7pm

Horsfall Stadium (classroom building)

MINUTES

1. Present: Adam Ali, Joke Ayodeji, Ashley Colley, Joanna Colley, Dave Eke, Garry Farooq, Simon Forde (secretary), Chris Hainsworth (chair), Dave Illingworth, Rachel Swingler, Luke Veevers (by video)

Apologies: Barry Markey, Nathan Markey, Vicky Maybin, Hassan Sabri, Dave Teggart, Anthony Watson, Ian Wild, Kyz Wild.

CH welcomed those members present.

The meeting discussed the meaning and understanding of the “quorum” in the Constitution. SF confirmed that it was originally intended to cover adult members only, while recognising that junior members were welcome to attend and fully entitled to vote and participate to the full. With 51 senior members, the quorum of 11 (one-fifth) was met.

The meeting recommended that the Constitution be amended to make this reading clear. See further minute 4b below.

2. The Minutes of previous AGM (26-Nov-2021) and the EGM (28-Jan-2022) were approved.

3. There were no Matters Arising that were not dealt with below.

4. Changes to the Club Constitution:

- a. The Secretary notifies the membership that the three Honorary Vice-Presidents are Eric Ainsworth, Joyce Swingler, and John Temperton.

The Honorary Life Members are Brian Elsey, Dave Illingsworth, and Gerard Mills.



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- b. The meeting agreed that Clauses 13.1 and 13.2 shall be changed from:

13.1 No business shall be transacted at any General Meeting unless a quorum is present. The quorum for an AGM or EGM shall be the greater of six Members or one-fifth of the total number of Members.

13.2 If a quorum is not present within half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting or if during a meeting a quorum ceases to be present, the meeting shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week at the same time and place as the Committee may determine.

To:

13.1 No business shall be transacted at any General Meeting unless a quorum is present. The quorum for an AGM or EGM shall be the greater of six Members or one-fifth of the total number of adult Members (aged 18 or older), while fully recognising the right of junior Members to take a full part in such meetings.

13.2 If a quorum is not present within half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting or if during a meeting a quorum ceases to be present, the meeting shall stand adjourned, unless the meeting comprises at least four non-committee members and two committee members, and such that the committee members do not form a majority. Such a meeting shall not decide on matters involving the Constitution and Membership Fees which must then be reserved for an adjourned meeting. An adjourned meeting shall take place on the next week at a time and place as the Committee may determine.

The auditor, DI, made the following observations:

- 1. He found a minor discrepancy of £30.
- 2. He recommended that all outgoing payments need to be against an invoice or the equivalent written request, and all such documents must be retained by the Treasurer.

GF recommended and the meeting agreed as follows:

- 3. The Club should open an interest-bearing deposit account, if possible, in addition to the current account. It should hold money earned from 1 April 2023 onwards from members that is destined for Horsfall stadium fees, including money earned from Associate Members.

SF recommended and the meeting agreed as follows:

- 4. The annual accounts should in future include a section of Payments Due (incoming or outgoing) so that a clearer picture of liabilities and assets is visible.

The Treasurer's report was received and accepted, subject to these recommendations:

c. Membership Secretary's Report

AC recommended that the Committee should review targets for future years in March 2023. He believes that longer-term junior growth was likely but he recommended in the short-term promoting running groups for adults.

Growth was restrained by a shortage of leaders and coaches. DE believed that university students might prove a source. CH favoured a focus on Bradford College's Leadership in Sport course.

The meeting recommended sending reps to the Junior Parkrun in Halifax, designing a flyer (via Michael Long) and developing the Associate Membership programme with more clubs.

While post-pandemic 2022/23 involved an inevitable sizeable churn from 2021/22, CH believes that retention should increase and churn reduce.



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6. Club Development Plan (annex 2 below)

GF reported that progress had exceeded expectations. However, the numerical targets should be revised in late 2022 for years 3 onwards.

GF recommended that the Committee allocate an hour at a number of meetings during the year to allow an in-depth consideration of key topics, such as coaching capacity, membership growth, producing flyers.

JC proposed a series of new venues for junior parkruns in the calendar.

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Annex 1:

Chair and Secretary's Report

Team Competitions and Performance

Peco Cross-Country League 2021/22:

- The men's team were 7th of 10 in the third tier (Division 2) with 8 runners taking part. This is one place higher than the previous year and shows year-on-year improvement. George Dickinson was 8th overall in MSen. Ash Colley and Dave Teggart were 50th and 51st overall (of 666).
- The women's team were again 10th of 10 in the third tier (Division 2) with just two runners taking part. Anna Smith was 15th overall in the F55 category and Hawarun Hussain 36th in the F45 group.
- Four juniors took part in the league. Olivia Colley placed 9th overall among the year 2-4 girls, having completed all five races, and Gabrielle Piliponis was 16th but could have been higher had she completed more than three races. Ryan Wild finished 11th overall among the year 2-4 boys, having completed four of the five races. Isla Wild ended a good 38th of 61 in the year 7-8 girls.

Northern T&F Senior League 2022:

- BAAC finished fifth of seven in Division 2EC, the best position for many years. For the first time in a long time the field events outscored the track.

London Marathon 2022:

- Ash Colley was awarded the free place from the club but was injured and unable to compete.

Hosted Events and Race Stewarding

1. Firefighters 5: the event was cancelled this year (and will be for 2023) due to building works at the Birkenshaw fire headquarters, the race headquarters. A replacement is being planned.
2. Members marshalled at the Epilepsy Action Bradford 10K and Bradford City Runs.

Horsfall

Horsfall Community Stadium (HCS) is a charitable trust with a 35-year lease from Bradford Council and is now responsible for its upkeep and development. BAAC is one of three anchor tenants of the stadium alongside Bradford (Park Avenue) FC and West Bowling ARLFC. Athletics is represented on the seven-strong Board of Directors through the club secretary. In this respect BAAC is one of very few clubs in the UK that can be said to be part-owners of its stadium.

The condition of the track, however, continues to deteriorate and the throwing events area remains under tons of topsoil after the installation of an artificial pitch on the infield in 2020.



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Netting is still not yet installed to protect athletes from balls straying from the pitch; other behavioural issues from players and spectators during our week-night slots and some difficulties with safe use during Sunday morning are outstanding and have not been fully resolved. **The committee considers these safety breaches by HCS as very serious.**

Two athletics-related developments at Horsfall are in detailed preparation:

- 1) A grant to install in the area behind the water jump a MUGA pitch (multi-use games area) for five-a-sides and other sports. Alongside this would be provision for a javelin runway, a shot/discus circle and respective throwing areas, and for pole vault. Detailed designs are not yet complete, but the Football Foundation seems favourable to the bid.
- 2) A complete resurface of the track in spring 2023, pending the approval of the MUGA and throwing events works above. The assumption is that this would be funded as follows:
 - a. A grant of £65k from Bradford Council
 - b. £100k business loan from BAAC (or benefactor?)
 - c. £10k a year from BAAC to fund the track's ongoing maintenance and replacement (e.g., by organising races)
 - d. £2k to £3k a year from the Development Group to fund infrastructure developments at Horsfall and jumps and throwing facilities (e.g., cages, runways).

Due to the safety issues mentioned above and the major financial commitment for the track, the committee is exploring alternative venues for the club to meet.

Committee

1. The club committee has been meeting monthly by skype. Full minutes are retained.
2. One major challenge is to continue the growth of membership after the huge fall-off during the pandemic, but this has largely been met. The club has benefited from Associate Membership agreements with Queensbury RC, Northowram Pumas and Bradford University AC; this means greater use of Horsfall plus income to the club to offset its annual fees to Horsfall, which will rise to £2400 + VAT from April 2023, and £3000 + VAT from April 2024. These associated clubs are contributing almost one half of these amounts, to supplement the £20 per head paid from each member's annual fee.
3. A second major challenge concerns the lack of qualified coaches, leaders, and first aiders. UK Athletics insurance guidelines recommend one leader per 12 participants. We are already at this limit and without a growth in qualified leaders we cannot grow membership as we wish. These welfare and safety concerns are exacerbated by the unsafe conditions offered at Horsfall.
4. The biggest challenge concerns the future of the Horsfall facility (above), the huge financial commitment we are expected to make, and whether the club should continue there.
5. Outside the main committee, with thanks to Joanna Colley, significant progress has been made with managing and supplying Kit and Equipment. The Facebook site is generating interest and greater engagement, and more social events are now being organised.



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Treasurer's Report

At the previous AGM the Treasurer reported audited accounts with a balance of £3598.06 on 1 April 2021. The bank balance at 31 March 2022 was £6256.82, but with some invoices, notably £1080 from Horsfall, still due.

During this period the club transferred its account to Metro Bank, Market Street, Bradford.

The current balance reported to the club Committee on 14 October 2023 was £4614.53, with £75 cash in hand, no creditors and one quarterly invoice of £540 (incl. VAT) to Horsfall stadium for the October-December 2022 period due.



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Membership Secretary's Report

The membership target for 2022-2023 is 100 paid members. We continue to make positive progress with our membership growth and now have a total of 67 paid members and the table below gives a detailed breakdown on the ratio splits of adults to juniors. We have 64% of adults against a target of 67% and 36% of juniors against a target of 34%. This means we are three-quarters towards our annual target with 4½ months left in this affiliated year, ending 31 March 2023.

The club is heading in the right direction to achieve the target of 100 members. We welcome any ideas and suggestions from members around actions we can take to help increase our membership growth. By the end of 2024 our aim is to have 225 subscribed members. The club committee will review the position with membership growth at year end and agree any changes to next year's target as appropriate.

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Annex 4

Proposed Schedule of Fees for 2023/24

The categories are identical to last year.

The rates are identical to last year, with the exception of a £1 rise in the rate for full members, reflecting a £1 increase in the fee we pay per member to England Athletics. Of the £41, £17 goes to EA (plus a flat £150 club affiliation charge) and £20 to Horsfall stadium, so barely £2 remains with the club.

The committee recognises that members will be confronting rising costs of living and wish to emphasise that the committee always looks considerably towards applications for a concessionary rate by members to whom this category should apply.

- Introductory (free) sessions: three
- Full members: **£41 (an increase of £1 due to EA's price rise)**

In this category Social (i.e., non-competing/racing) members will be eligible in the 2023-24 Renewal Notice to opt out from England Athletics membership

- Immediate family rate (three at full rate): **£20** after the first three family members
- Reduced period from 1 October to 31 March: **£35**
- Reduced period from 1 January to 31 March: **£30**
- Concessions: by application to committee
- Associates (members of other EA clubs): **£10/quarter, up to £40**
- Honorary and life members: free (may make an annual donation).
